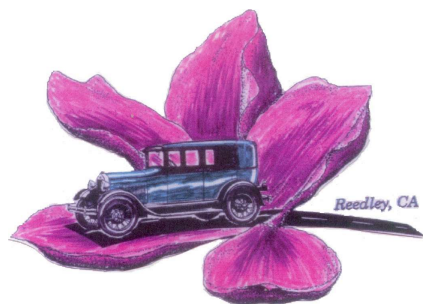

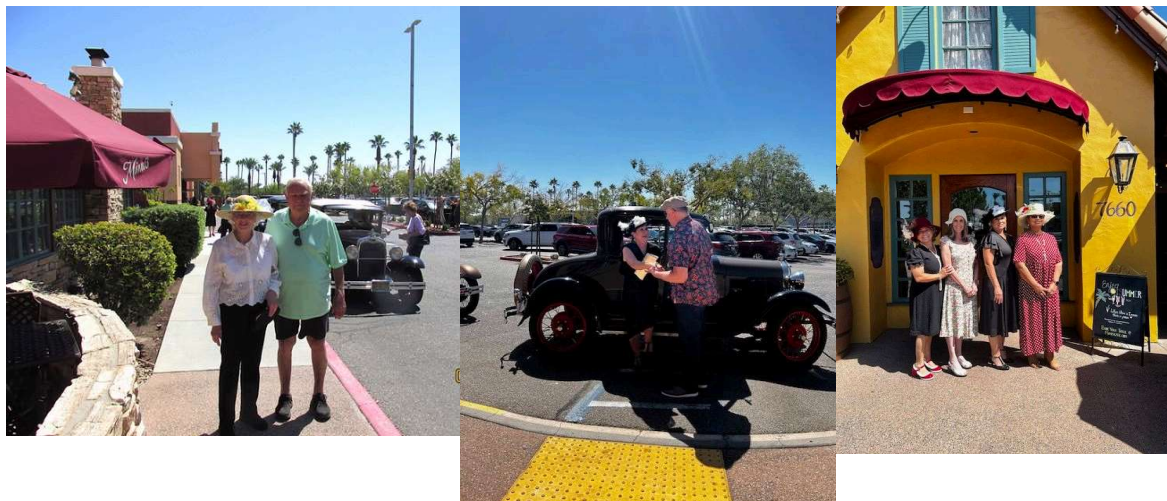

## Ford Model A Cooling System Back Flush – Yet Another Way

**Chemicals:** 19-25oz size Dawn dish soap; 3 gallons of distilled water; 32oz bottle of NAPA's Macs #1400 Radiator Cleaner; 32oz bottle of NAPA's Macs #1300 Anti-Rust; Full strength Anti-freeze at your discretion. You still might find the #1400 and #1300 in the 14.5oz containers. They are good to use. Macs changed concentrations. The 14.5oz works same as 32oz.

**Flush Adapter Boots:** One 2" x 1 1/2" Flex Coupling and one 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" Flex Coupling, and two 1 1/2" PVC Bushings with a 1/4" threaded female end that accepts a garden hose. That's four pieces total. These items are available in your hardware store plumbing section. Insert the PVC bushings into the Couplings and tighten to make each Boot. Two garden hoses will also be required. This is an opportune time to replace radiator hoses and/or hose clamps if needed, as well as lubing the water pump before the cleaning.

Henry and Edsel left us a nifty, efficient cooling system. It works much better when it's clean. Over-lubricating the water pump, release of minerals from tap water, and rust work together to reduce its cooling efficiency. This guide offers a step by step procedure for grease removal, flushing, and system prep for your driving season.

1. Start with **grease removal**. Add the Dawn pots and pans cleaner to your radiator and drive the car 15 or 20 minutes to heat up the engine and circulate the degreaser, then drain the radiator. Note: Others have used Pinesol and other brands of cleaners. The idea is to use a good detergent to remove the large containments before proceeding.
2. Fill the radiator with tap water and the #1400 cleaner. Drive the car enough to heat up the engine again and circulate the #1400, then drain. Phosphate is the important ingredient in the #1400 cleaner.
3. **Radiator Flush:** This is best done by first removing the hood and radiator support rods with the assistance of a helper, but not a must if you can handle it. Disconnect your upper and lower radiator hoses. Put the boots on the hoses first as follows. Screw the 2" x 1 1/2" Adapter Boot onto the end of a garden hose and attach it to the radiator inlet neck at the top. This serves as your discharge hose. Confirm the radiator cap is on. Screw the 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" Boot onto the garden hose from your faucet and attach it to the bottom of the radiator. Run water until the discharge is clear, about two minutes. The purpose is to **back flush the radiator from the bottom through the top, opposite normal flow** with the pressure from your garden hose. A particularly good job can be done with the radiator out of the car, but is not a must.
4. **Block Flush:** Connect your water source hose to the 2" x 1 1/2" Boot then connect that boot to the water outlet neck at the top of the head. Connect the 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" Boot and garden hose to the side inlet neck for your discharge. Turn on the water and flush until clear. Again, **this is opposite normal flow**.
5. Recall that system volume is 3 gallons. Reconnect all hoses. In this order, fill the radiator with the #1300 Radiator Anti-Rust, Anti-freeze (if using), and distilled water as needed. The #1300 is a rust and corrosion inhibitor, and surfactant such as Water Wetter, Purple Ice, etc. It will turn the water in the radiator a milky white. The radiator only needs to be filled to the point where the radiator tube openings in the bottom of the upper tank are covered. Do not fill to the top of the tank. The Model A radiator will often seek its own water level and will discharge the water in an over filled tank due to expansion as the engine heats up.

## ***September 20th Kingsburg Historical Park Tour & lunch***

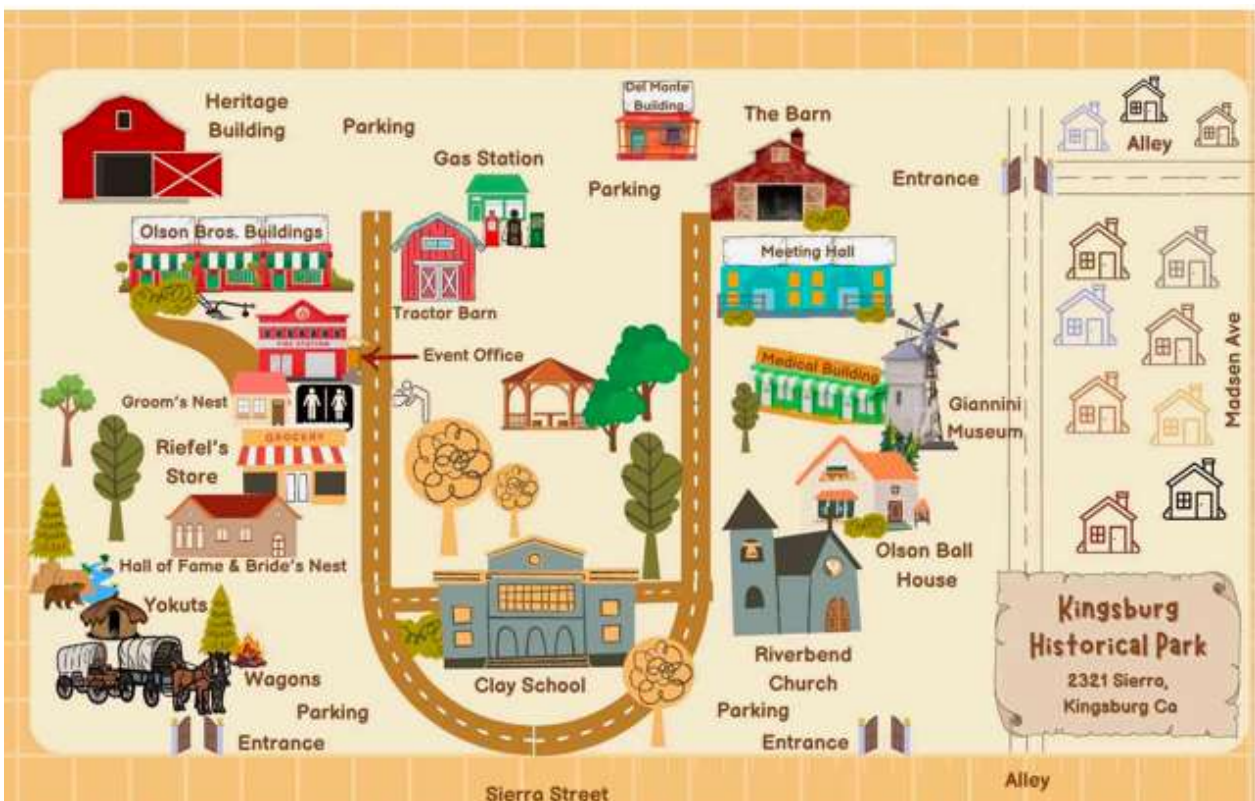

## Back To School Wardrobe For The Stylish Schoolgirl Of 1930 And 1931

Imagine crisp autumn mornings, the school bell ringing through golden leaves, and girls stepping out in tailored plaid dresses with collars starched just so. For shoes, polished Mary Janes complemented argyle knee socks, while a felt cloche hat fashionable and practical—framed their keen eyes as they hurried down the brick path. Each ensemble was thoughtfully chosen, reflecting the spirit of the times.

In an article in Woman's Home Companion, titled "Until She is Twelve" gave answers for mother's on how their girls should be dressed. Simplicity was the word used, keeping the line of the dress simple and making it with sturdy material. The fashion of these years balanced youthful exuberance with the refined elegance that marked the early years of the decade, blending practicality with a playful sophistication.

Although Montgomery Wards Catalog, thought different. They were producing dresses by mass and wanted to sell them for a reasonable price. Patterns played a starring role, with cheerful checks and gentle florals stitched on frocks that swung just below the knee for 8 to 12 set and above the knee for the younger set. Amidst the routine, each girl's wardrobe told a quiet story of family pride, resourcefulness, and the gentle hopefulness of a new school year.

If you made your girl's clothes you could follow the advice of Woman's Home Companion. You could also use many of the Needlecraft patterns found in most Needlecraft magazines of the era. I choose to talk about 1930-1931 because I have quite a collection of these years as our cars are all 1930's and 1931's.

Accessories added the finishing touch—a knitted scarf in a cheery hue, or perhaps a petite satchel slung across a determined shoulder, carrying books bound in brown paper and pencils sharp as ambition. As the air chilled, girls bundled in woolen coats with velvet collars and neat rows of buttons. Gloves, sometimes hand-stitched by mothers or older sisters, kept fingers warm on frosty mornings.
