

Something Special


Vintage Treasures Enter the Public Domain in 2026

Each New Year's Day, a fresh batch of creative works enters the **public domain**, meaning they're now free for anyone to use, share, or adapt. On January 1, 2026, works published in 1930 will be released — the same era when our Model A Fords were rolling proudly off the line.

Here are a few fun highlights from that year:

Books

- *The Maltese Falcon* — the classic detective novel.
- *The Secret of the Old Clock* — the very first Nancy Drew mystery.



Films & Cartoons

- *All Quiet on the Western Front* — early Academy Award winner.
- *Soup to Nuts* — featuring the comedy team that became The Three Stooges.
- *Dizzy Dishes* — Betty Boop's very first appearance.
- Several 1930 Mickey Mouse cartoons also become free to use.



Music

Thanks to a different law, **sound recordings from 1925** will enter the public domain in 2026 — including Bessie Smith, Louis Armstrong sessions, and early jazz favorites.


A Quick Note About the Model A

People sometimes ask whether the Model A “entered the public domain.” In short: the **design and mechanical patents expired decades ago**, so the car itself has long been freely usable — but **Ford's trademarks** (the Ford name, the oval, and “Model A”) remain protected.

Why It's Fun for Us

Public domain releases give us new material to enjoy from the Model A era: music for club events, classic films for a movie night, or even old illustrations and ads we can reprint freely.

In short, 2026 opens the door to more of the world our cars once lived in.— a little gift from the past to start the new year.




Resolutions for What we Want More of in 2026
