Our Fall Technical seminar focused on front wheel alignment and wheel balancing. Although no one wanted to try their hand at aligning their car we did have two brave members that brought their wheels and successfully balanced them. 18 people showed up for the seminar and seven of them drove








their As. After we completed the alignment and balancing Mike Laurita demonstrated a selection of products he found to really make your car shine.









I decided to stop into Adam's Polishes (8225 N Valley Highway, Thornton) to ask about polishes for lacquer paint. They had me talk to one of their vintage/classic specialists and he gave me some ideas of what would work on a Model A. I started with a waterless spray car wash (not using the car wash or hose very much after talking with them). Just spray on and wipe off! The second step was the Scratch & Swirl Remover, and without much work there was a huge difference in my fender finish and look (I only did the fenders and very little else). After finishing up, I began with the Hand Polish which shined up the A. Next step is the Graphene Wax, and I am excited to see the finished product (Haven't used it yet). During the seminar (only using the Scratch & Swirl Remover) we removed some swirls on a fender (then polished it with the Hand Polish), made some mis-coloring on a rear quarter panel go away, and removed some gas/paint issues near a gas tank. On a side note, I am only using microfiber towels that are made for cars to dry, clean, and polish the car so nothing scratches it. Cleaning and polishing has been modernized and is not the hard work that it was in the past. Please ask me questions if you need further help. Links to these products:
