

I hope all of you had a great Christmas and are going to have a Happy and healthy New Year.





Bring a picnic lunch or eat at the Hotel. **March 28 – De Anza Cove Mission Bay** for Kite Flying & Bar-B-Que. Meet at the South Shores Boat Ramp at 9:00 AM. **April 12 – OC Pancake Breakfast.**

Treasurer: [Nayola Bieber] Checking account balance included **money deposited in November**: \$37 Ways & Means; \$37.00 Refreshments; \$960.00 Membership; \$75.00 Advertising; & \$1,050.00 Installation Banquet (a total of \$2,159.00). **Bills to pay.** \$300.00 to CHL Church for meeting space July-December 2025; Memorials to MAFFI of \$100.00 each for members who have passed recently (Billie Bonnorant, Reen Kotas & Carolyn Kaiser) for a total of \$300.00 to MAFFI; \$75.00 to MAFCA for yearly director/officer insurance/general liability insurance; \$20.00 Reimburse Paul Winchester for yearly registration with Secretary of State. A motion was made by Steve Lovell to pay these bills; seconded by Rod Tuttle; approved by all members.

2026 Budget – Guy informed the membership that the Board met recently to discuss the budget for 2026. Nayola as Treasurer compiled expenses from 2025 and prepared a budget for 2026. The budget contains \$300.00/year for parade entry fees (if needed), as previously voted to utilize income from displays (Eastlake, retirement communities, Etc.). Additionally budgeted was memorial donations to MAFFI. 



Model A Gas Gauge

Happy New Year!! Only 365 more days to go.



This year we have an opportunity to travel to Pendleton Oregon for MAFCA's Convention running from May 31st 2026 through June 7th 2026. I will be putting together a SCRG Tour to the Convention.

One thing that you may want to check before you drive to Oregon is the gas gauge. There is nothing worse than running out of gas on 395 in eastern Oregon.

Several years ago I replaced my tank float with a new cork/neoprene one. (There is a good you tube video by Paul Shinn on replacing the float and cleaning up the gauge.) After I replaced the float I wanted to check the gauge to see where empty was, the old float showed empty when the -0- was just showing. After bending the wire a little I got the -0- to show at the mid- point when empty. Ford designed the gauge to show all the levels at the mid-point. So you can bend the float wire when all the way up to read -F- at the mid-point and then empty will also read -0- at the same mid-point. I always set the gauge at -0- as I am more concerned to have that accurate than full.

When I restored the car I bought the more expensive gauge tool set, but found that the 3/4" square wrench for the inner ring needed a 3/4" six sided wrench not the four sided one. I took a 1/2" bolt and put two nuts on it and made a wrench that fit exactly into the inner ring. If you have made the four sided wrench fit in a six sided ring nut let me know.

The square T handle wrench did not work, The 1/2" bolt needs a 3/4" wrench and the nut fits fine.



BINGO!

Where Bingo Began: Italy is where the history of bingo began. It is the birthplace of bingo, but in the form of a national lottery, “Lo Giuoco Lotto Italia.” Bingo was invented in 1530. We guess that makes the Italians trendsetters from the word go—quite literally—as this was just after the country became unified. It has been played weekly ever since, almost without pause.



It may be hard to imagine, but 1530s Saturday night Lotto was incredibly similar to the 90 ball bingo we play today. Players had cards with rows, and winning numbers were pulled from a sack as players scrambled to match their numbers first, revealing the winners and losers. By the late 1770s, Lotto had become so popular it crossed borders for the first time, spreading to France as “Le Lotto”. The French shook things up a bit and the bingo cards were modified into the standard 3 rows, 9 vertical, that now make up a 90 Ball bingo card today. When Lotto found its way to Germany in the 1800s, it was a child’s learning game to teach anything from numbers to adjectives.

History of Bingo in the USA: Fast forward through the history of bingo to just over a century or so more, and bingo had made it almost across the world, but under a different name. **Evidence suggests the game was first dubbed ‘Bingo’ in the US, in 1929.**

Legend has it that a toy manufacturer from Long Island, named Edwin S Lowe, first played the game at a carnival in Georgia, where it had become known as ‘Beano’ due to beans being used to mark numbers.

The reason it turned from “beano” to bingo is actually quite funny. Edwin Lowe overheard a beano player scream “Bingo!” accidentally. He thought that bingo had a better ring to it and would be better for marketing purposes. Lowe had been working on the game to mass produce it and had friends over at his apartment to test it out, which is when “Bingo” slipped out of one over-excited player’s mouth and basically became the name we all now play under and excitedly call out when we win!

Lowe sold his first product, 12 cards for \$1 and 24 cards for \$2, but there were always too many winners in each game! Lowe also decided he needed to increase the number of squares on the bingo card to make it take off commercially. He searched for a partner and met a math professor named Carl Leffler. Leffler taught at the University of Columbia and agreed to help Lowe with his venture. Leffler toiled over the mathematical

possibilities and came up with a total of 6000 different bingo cards for production. Soon after the game was ready to be mass-produced, a Catholic priest asked Lowe if he could use the game in churches to raise funds. Lowe’s agreed, and soon, more and more churches were playing his free game. Since so many people were playing bingo at church, it grew in popularity very quickly in the mainstream, too.



By 1934, roughly 10,000 bingo games were played weekly by Americans. Today, more than \$90 million is spent on bingo in North America every week, and all this is under the name we all love: bingo!
