
Just a little moment for a Mum to brag...

Horn Maintenance



Oiling

Tools and Supplies:


- Flat blade screw driver
- Scotch Bright pad (or similar)
- Sewing machine oil
- Kerosene
- Toothpicks

Procedure:

- 1. Remove the dirt build up from the upper and lower oiling felts. Clean with kerosene and pad dry.
- 2. Polish the commutator with a Scotch Bright pad. Clean between the gaps with a toothpick.
- 3. Apply two drops of sewing machine oil to both the upper and lower oiling felts.
- 4. Lightly grease the upper and lower tips of the motor shaft, as well as the bottom of the ratchet

Designed primarily for the carriage of sheep or small live stock, Type No. 550 is also convertible to a general-purpose vehicle. For this reason, it is a very popular style on station or farm.

The truck is fitted with two decks for live stock, each deck being divided into two roomy pens. Each pen has a wide opening on both sides, thus giving eight openings altogether. This enables the truck to be loaded or unloaded on either side. Portable ramps for loading purposes can be supplied at small additional cost.

The stock body is held rigidly in place by steel supports of ample dimensions strengthened by wooden cross supports which also form the sides.

The truck is convertible to either dropside or platform type easily and quickly.


