FIRST RELEASE OF THE MODEL A FORD DECEMBER 2, 1927

In late November came the announcement that Americans had been waiting for: On December 2, 1927, the still –unnamed Ford automobile would be shown to the public, at locations revealed to each and every Ford dealer. Pricing was announced on December 1, the eve of the showing, and to the delight of potential buyers, the new Model A would be priced comparably to the Model T. On the day of the car's reveal, Ford News, claimed that 10,534,992 people came to see the Model A, a number that represented 10 percent of the U.S. population at the time.

The Model A offered buyers elegant styling (described as a "downsized Lincoln" by some), four-wheel brakes, improved fuel economy, a laminated safety glass windshield, hydraulic shock absorbers, and a 200-5 cu.in. four-cylinder engine rated at 40 horsepower, enough to deliver a top speed of 65 MPH. Seven body types were offered at launch, including Sport Coupe, Coupe, Roadster, Phaeton, Tudor sedan, Fordor sedan, and truck, and buyers could choose from four colors (Niagara Blue, Arabian Sand, Dawn Gray and Gun Metal Blue).

Deposits from eager customers poured in, and in the first two weeks the automaker had reportedly accumulated 400,000 sales orders from dealers (adding to the thousands of orders that had been placed prior to the car's reveal). Though the Model A would only be produced from 1927 through early 1932, Ford sold over 4.3 million examples, and the car would help Ford transition from pioneer to modern automaker. The Model A would also go on to inspire generations of collectors, hot rodders and shade tree mechanics, helping to popularize the hobby that we've all come to know and love.

Holiday Diet Rules

Overcating can be a problem during the holidays and special events. Here are some simple rules that will help you through any holiday eating season.

- Food that you eat when no one is looking does not have any calories. Somebody must actually see you eat the food for the calories to count.
- 2. Food licked off of kitchen utensils does not have any calories. The process of cooking caused the calories to be present.
- 3. Holiday cookies contain calories, but the pieces do not. To avoid calories, break the cookies into pieces before eating. The process of breaking causes calorie leakage.
- 4. Vegetables contain calories, but coating them with sour cream will prevent the calories from escaping into the body.
- 5. Snack food eaten at the office during regular business hours does not contain any calories. The U. S. Department of Agriculture does not consider this to be a nutritious meal, so the calories do not count.
- Diet soda cancels calories. If you drink diet soda while eating a pizza, there are no calories in the meal.
- 7. The calories in alcohol can be deducted from other calories consumed. Alcohol burns in the engine of a car and in a human body, alcohol burns calories. (E-85 is not a substitute for alcohol)
- 8. When you eat with someone else, your calories do not count if the other person eats more than you do. It is a good idea to always eat with someone larger than you are. If everyone around you is big, then you are thin.
- 9. There are no calories in entertainment. Food consumed when you go out to eat contains no calories if you consider the meal to be entertainment. It helps to go out with an entertaining person, especially if they are also big.
- 10. Foods of the same color have the same number of calories. For example, a slice of grape-fruit and a slice of lemon meringue pie have the same number of calories. IMPORTANT: Brown is a generic color, so chocolate may be substituted for any food of any color.
