1.If using a Smartphone or Tablet, open up the App Store (Apple) or Play Store (Android), and search "Instagram".

2.Download the App to your smartphone or tablet and create an account.

3. Once created, you can now use the search function to find personal accounts, company accounts, etc.

4. Once you find an account of interest (Family members account or Brand name account), you click "Follow" so that every picture/post they add to their account, will show up in your newsfeed in which you can scroll through.

5. Another popular function to use for finding Model A's for example would be to use a "hashtag" which is the symbol, #. To find all pictures of a Model A that accounts have posted, you could type into the search function something such as #fordmodela or you can type in something like #roadsters, #classicford, #vintagecars, #oldcars, etc. You get the picture! 
suggestion made earlier this year that meetings be moved to Saturday morning's, so people can drive and drive their Model As. That was poopooed.

Greta Garbo

Women's wear 1930

Increasingly, women looked to movie stars for fashion inspiration during this period. Hollywood disseminated fashion to the masses and stars like Greta Garbo (Fig. 10), Marlene Dietrich (Fig. 11), and Bette Davis, among others, became some of the first Hollywood style icons. Many women all over the world attempted to emulate their style. Making this a little easier was a rise in makeup and the beauty industry, allowing women to copy their favorite stars at a small cost. Blackman writes:

"Every woman could imitate and buy into, at relatively little cost, the look of her favourite stars, if only through copying their makeup and hairstyles: cinema democratized the empire of fashion by making glamour accessible."

Henry Ford—Antisemite?

Public apologies to Jews

After several of his articles were republished by different magazines with remarks and misunderstood, Henry Ford was proclaimed as an enemy of Jewish nation by some of organizations. In order to calm the situation down and to make everything clear, he made an official statement in the American Jewish Year Book (1927). In this statement he explained what exactly happened with those articles of his and how everything happened.



He said: "Had I appreciated even the general nature, to say nothing of the details ,of these utterances, I would have forbidden their circulation without a moment's hesitation, because I am

fully aware of the virtues of the Jewish people as a whole, of what they and their ancestors have done for civilization and for mankind and toward the development of commerce and industry, of their sobriety and diligence, their benevolence and their unselfish interest in the public welfare."

And then added: "Those who know me can bear witness that it is not in my nature to inflict insult upon and to occasion pain to anybody, and that it has been my effort to free myself from prejudice. Because of that I frankly confess that I have been greatly shocked as a result of my study and examination of the files of The Dearborn Independent and of the pamphlets entitled 'The International Jew."




It should be noted that the




My contact at the LAFD asked what topics we would like addressed and I suggested 1. land-
