
MEMBERS TRAVEL TO THE GREAT NORTHWEST


Two of our Santa Anita Model A Club families recently participated in the Northwest Regional Group Hub Tour in Long Beach, Washington from September 21st thru the 26th.

John & Cheryl Manifor and Les & Lyla Eddington trailered their A's there and joined in on the fun. The NWRG Tour covered about 400 miles in total.

Many of Western Canada, Oregon, Washington and Northern California clubs had anywhere from one to nine vehicles on this tour. The clubs' participants drove or trailered a total of 89 Model A's to Long Beach, a resort town that boasts of the longest contiguous sandy beach in North America. It's 28 miles long.

The itineraries included forts (six around the mouth of the Columbia River), museums, a covered bridge, lighthouses, a ferry crossing the Columbia River, logging camps and a cranberry bog with a museum. The region's heavily forested valleys are interspersed with tidal rivers, small towns and pastureland.







BODY & PAINT SEMINAR

Let me say in the beginning, Carl Rogers, a longtime member (50 years) of our club, is a consummate model guy. He does body work, engine building, sands, primes and paints his own cars. From that knowledge and firsthand experience, he led the attendees (16-some of whom drove their Model A's) in the relevant prep procedures of metal straightening, sand blasting, sanding, priming and painting. Relevant tools were demonstrated and Carl's 29 Chevy body was used as a prop, which he is currently restoring.




