Ford Then and Now: Ford Summer Vacation Homes by Curt Carlson

Summer has always been my favorite season. Summer always meant a change of pace, no school, sweet corn, watermelon, more time with family and travels to somewhere new. I wondered how Henry Ford spent his summer vacations and found some stories you may find interesting.



Then:

Henry Ford valued hard work, but he also valued his time away from work. He loved nature and exploring, so its no surprise that he would go fishing on vacation. One place he frequented was an outdoor club, the Au Sable Trout and Game Club, near Grayling Michigan. He stayed in a fine lodge, the Douglas Hotel, built by a lumber baron. The lodge was about 200 miles from Dearborn,, but the trip wasn't too bad if you owned your own rail car, as Henry did. The rail car made it easy to bring friends along as well.

In 1915 as a reward to himself for the early success of his company, Henry built a vacation "cottage" on 10 acres on the shore of Lake Huron, near the town of Port Huron. The home was only about 70 miles from Dearborn, so it was easily reached by car, boat or train for a weekend of escaping the heat of the city. Ford was encouraged to sell the property in 1929 for concerns of crimes against wealthy people as the Depression worsened.

In the 1920s, Henry really wanted to join an exclusive hunting and fishing club, the Huron Mountain Club. The Club was limited to 50 members and they jointly owned 20,000 acres of pristine wilderness in the Michigan upper peninsula, along the shore of Lake Superior. The only way to get in to the club was for a member to die and the surviving family wanting to sell the membership. Clearly, a long waiting list to join. As the story goes, the state of Michigan was building a highway just south of the Huron Mountain Club property. Henry bought major sections of land on both sides of the proposed highway and successfully lobbied to get the highway project cancelled. Henry was allowed to join. He had his famous architect, Albert Kahn build a significant log "cabin" in the Huron Mountain community. This home was Clara's favorite vacation home. Henry was able to keep tabs on business with four sawmill operations and two mining operations nearby.

Now:

The Au Sable river is still a popular trout fishing area in Michigan and the Douglas Hotel has been restored and operates as Fuller's North Branch Outing Club. Fun to visit there sometime. The Harbor Beach Cottage still exists and is privately owned. I read that a Model T club included a drive by on a tour.

The Huron Mountain Club is still extremely private and exclusive. The Ford "cabin" still exists but is privately owned. The nearby Ford sawmills and mines are long gone. https://askus.thehenryford.org/researchguides/faq/375309






Tech Tip by Willie Priaulx

When it's time to replace or repair your starter, you may want to consider a Modern Starter Drive. The Original Bendix Spring Drive has some known issues, as anyone who has fished the sheared off spring bolts out of the bell housing can testify. Many of these problems have been resolved as automotive technology improves over the years.

To help with the installation of the Modern Starter Drive, the club has added a new tool to our Specialty Tools collection. Club tools are available for loan to any Central Iowa Club member.

Modern Starter Drive Spring Compressor Tool.

The spring compressor makes installing the modern starter drive easier. It will compress the drive spring and hold the retaining collar back while you set the mounting screw, without needing all 3 hands.



Selecting the Correct Spark Plug

- Q: What do you recommend for a set of new spark plugs for a Model A? I currently have Champion C16C spark plugs. They seem to be doing fine, but I'd like to carry a spare set.
 - Kevin Szcodronski
- **A:** The original show quality spark plug still available is the Champion 3X, three-piece plug. \$50 / \$32 each. The only reason to pay this much for a spark plug is for authenticity.

Champion also makes 2 one-piece plugs for the Model A in 2 heat ranges. These are substantial, nice looking plugs, but not original.

Champion W18 (Hot) - \$12 / \$8 Champion W16Y (Cool) - \$12 / \$8

Low-cost options.
Autolite 3076 - \$7 / \$3
Motorcraft TT10 - Discontinued

I can't find the Champion C16C number you are using. That may be an older W16 equivalent. What most A drivers choose, and for your driving style, I'd recommend the hotter W18.

It depends on how the car will be driven as to what heat range should be used. I suggest the W18 plugs in stock and modified Model A engines. If you plan on long trips at continued high speed or racing at full throttle, then a cooler plug like the Champion W16Y would suit your needs. But, the W16Y may be too cold for average use with stop-and-go driving and could run the plugs black and sooty.

All of these plugs are readily available and have the large 7/8" base. I see NO reason to use a smaller 14mm "modern" plug with an adapter.


