


Learning about birds at our General Meeting August 6th

Key Characteristics of 1928 U.S. or California Highway Maps:

U.S. Numbered Highways:

By 1928, the U.S. Numbered Highways system had been in place for about two years, replacing many of the older named routes with a more standardized numbering system.

Named Routes:

Older, named routes, like the <u>Lincoln Highway</u> (which became <u>U.S. Route 30</u> in many places), were still featured, often on the same maps as the new numbered highways.

Cartographers and Publishers:

Companies like Rand McNally and publishers such as Gallup's and the H.M. Gousha Company produced these maps.

Details on the Maps:

Beyond routes, these maps often included helpful features for travelers, such as lists of approved hotels, restaurants, and auto repair stations.

National vs. Regional Maps:

Some maps were comprehensive atlases of the entire nation, while others focused on specific regions, like the Mideastern states or California.

Historical Significance:

These maps are valuable collector's items and provide a historical snapshot of the nation's transportation system at a time of significant expansion and change.

Where to Find 1928 Highway Maps

Online Archives: The <u>David Rumsey Map Collection</u> has examples of these maps, including a general United States map and specific state highway maps.

Auction Sites: Vintage maps from 1928 can be found on sites like eBay.

Libraries: Institutions like the Library of Congress also hold collections of these historical documents.





Time meeting was adjourned: 9pm








