





If you enjoyed the Pumpkin Cheesecake Bars that Kay Wieder brought to the last meeting, you can now make them yourself. Here is the recipe.

Ingredients For the Crust:

- 1 3/4 cups Graham Cracker Crumbs (about 10-12 Whole Crackers)
- 1/2 cup Salted Butter, Melted
- 2 Tbsp. Powdered Sugar

Ingredients For Filling:

- 2 8-oz.cream cheese, at room temperature
- ³/₄ cup sugar
- 3 large eggs
- 3 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- 15 oz. can Pumpkin
- 1 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- (I added 2 Tbsp Powdered Sugar)

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Lightly coat 9-in. baking pan with cooking spray, then line with parchment paper leaving overhang on two sides.
- 2. Place graham cracker crumbs, melted butter, and powdered sugar in a mixing bowl and mix until well combined. Press firmly into the bottom and partway up the sides of the prepared baking dish.
- 3. Bake in preheated oven for 10–12 minutes, or until crust is just starting to change color. Set aside to cool completely.
- 4. Meanwhile, make filling: In a clean bowl, pulse together cream cheese, sugar and eggs. Pulse in flour and salt to combine, then pulse pumpkin and pumpkin pie spice to combine.
- 5. Pour pumpkin mixture onto cooled crust.
- 6. Bake until set at edges but still slightly jiggly in center 30 34 minutes. (I added 3 or 4 minutes. Think it depends on your oven). Transfer to a wire rack and let cool completely in pan, then refrigerate until chilled, at least 2 hours. Cut onto squares and serve.
- 7. Serve with whipped cream, whipped topping or ice cream.
