
Get your Model A out for Halloween!

Went for a ride last night. Had some engine trouble.



Tech Tip: Henry anchored the steering column with a bracket riveted to the gas tank. Many drivers grip the steering when they are getting into the car. Due to the repeated stress, over time the tank may begin to leak under that bracket. The aftermarket came up with a way to avoid that possibility. In the picture below you will see a bracket that is anchored on the dash rather than the tank. You will also see half of the original bracket. You might want to consider this preventative measure. The part is available from the usual vendors.
