

After Kenny graduated from high school he went on a 5-month mountaineering trip throughout the Pacific Northwest. Upon his return, he worked with his brother in the air conditioning trade and retired after 28 years. He then opened his own handyman business and now is fully retired.

June worked as a Chief Operating Officer for a dermatology group for 36 years. She had built out 27 dermatology practices and consulted with many practices throughout her career. She has spoken at numerous dermatology conferences in the United States and has served on advisory boards with pharmaceutical and insurance companies. Gunther's Yard Tour

December 7, 2025 3639 Senasac Ave, Long Beach, CA 90808

Gunther's Yard is a beloved private collection and event space known for its vintage vehicles and nostalgic Americana. It is a unique and privately maintained collection founded by the late George Gunther, and run by his family. The Yard is best known for hosting the annual Gunther's Yard Show, a gathering that takes place on the first Sunday of December each year.

The Yard features an impressive array of antique motorcycles, classic trucks, vintage cars, trains, military vehicles, and hit-and-miss engines. It is not a commercial venue but a passion project, and the event has a warm, community-driven atmosphere. It's a favorite among collectors and fans of vintage machinery.

Gunther's Yard also offers vintage props and vehicles for film rentals, including a 60" searchlight mounted on a vintage truck. The Yard is not open to the public year-round. Access is typically limited to special events like the December show or by invitation.

If you're into antique vehicles or nostalgic Americana, this hidden gem is worth keeping on your radar!


