

Proposed Changes to the Bylaws Meadowlark Model A Ford Club

The Board of Directors is recommending several changes in the Meadowlark Model A Ford Club Bylaws to the club's members. Here are the proposed changes and reasoning for each:

Article 3, Section 3 - Raise annual dues from \$24.00 to \$25.00.

This is proposed to facilitate cash payments for club dues and the necessity to make appropriate change.

Article 6, Section 1 - Revise sentences 2 and 3 to read: 'The Term of the President, Vice-President / President-Elect shall be one year. The term of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be 2 years.'

Currently, the Secretary serves for 1 year. This proposal would have the Secretary serve for 2 years in order to help maintain continuity with the club's records and to be consistent with the term of the Treasurer.

Article 6, Section 3 - Eliminate the last sentence of Paragraph 1.

Currently, the last sentence of Paragraph 1 reads: 'Nominations for the offices of President (if necessary), Vice President / President-Elect, Secretary, and Treasurer shall consist of a minimum of two candidates for each of the said offices.' This proposal reflects the reality the nominations committee routinely faces: securing a minimum of 2 candidates for the officer positions on the Board. While it is certainly desirable to have a minimum of 2 candidates for these positions, the Board recommends eliminating this as a requirement.

Article 6, Section 5 - Revise the second sentence to eliminate the parenthetical at the end of the sentence.

The sentence currently reads: 'The Officers and Directors shall be installed at the annual membership meeting in January. They shall serve until the installation of Officers and Directors in the following year (two years for the Treasurer and Directors). There is no need for the parenthetical because the terms served by each position have already been defined.



Here is something to plan ahead for:

The Model A Ford Club of Colorado is planning the 2027 MAFCA National Tour in Durango, Colorado. June 13 to 18, 2027. Durango is a historic mountain city founded in 1880 by the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad, known for outdoor recreation in the San Juan Mountains and the scenic Animas River. http://www.mafcc.org/2027-mafca-national-tour.html Only about 850 miles from Omaha. Hope some of us can make it!



Ed and Millie Jankowski (pictured above) have been Meadowlark members since 1981. We don't see them often since they moved to Eudora, Kansas, but they are still members.






