

I hope to see you all at our next club meeting on Wednesday, February 4th, at Goleta Presbyterian Church, 6067 Shirrell Way.




Stop Three: Randy & Sue's Home

January 7, 2026 General Meeting Minutes



Location: Cody's Café (Breakfast Meeting – Trial Format) **Meeting Called to Order:** 9:15 a.m. **Presiding:** Randy Douglas

Call to Order & Opening Remarks: Randy called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. and explained that this morning breakfast meeting was an experiment, as the club has traditionally met on Wednesday evenings. Members were invited to share feedback on the meeting time and location.

Secretary's Report: There was no Secretary's Report, as no meeting was held in December.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Steve Penniman presented his report and reviewed the club's current financial status, year-end summary, and a proposed 2026 budget. He noted that some membership dues and sponsorships are still outstanding and expressed optimism that remaining payments will be received soon.

Steve explained that the club intentionally spent down funds in 2025 to support activities such as the Christmas party and that the proposed 2026 budget may plan for expenses exceeding income, depending on meeting facility costs and event decisions. Options for reducing expenses—such as meeting locations and cost-sharing for events—were discussed.

Members complimented the clarity and organization of the financial report and thanked Steve for his work.

Meeting Location & Schedule Discussion: There was general discussion about the advantages and challenges of morning versus evening meetings. While breakfast meetings offer potential cost savings, members noted that work schedules, medical appointments, and other commitments can make daytime meetings difficult for some, just as evenings can be challenging for others.

Randy noted that the board will continue evaluating options and may consider alternating meeting times, with a published calendar to help members plan ahead.

Alarm Clock Drawing: The alarm clock sounded at **9:39 a.m.** **Winner: Randy**, who selected the closest time.

Announcements & Member Updates

- **Fred** shared that Cindy recently had a hip replacement and is recovering well, though she is not yet driving. Fred paid his dues at the meeting and noted he would need to leave early.
- The **January Lunner** is scheduled for **January 17**; members were encouraged to RSVP.
- Randy introduced a short, humorous racing video, which was enjoyed by the group.

Old Business: No old business was brought forward.

New Business

- **Potential Model A Vehicles for Sale:** Bob Carty reported contact from an individual in Santa Barbara with two Model A vehicles needing restoration. Information will be shared with interested members.
- **Car Lift Donation Discussion:** A possible donated two-post car lift from Ed Firth was discussed. Members reviewed potential storage locations, power requirements, transportation logistics, and the need for a volunteer group to assist with removal and installation. Further planning is needed

Car Projects

- Aaron shared progress on his restoration project and discussed parts needs.
- Randy reported progress on licensing and driving his 1926 Model T, including recent mechanical work and successful road testing.
- **Maintenance Tips:** Aaron provided guidance on greasing water pumps, front hubs, rear axle fittings, and general lubrication intervals.
- **Safety Clinic:** A Safety Clinic is planned for **February**. Steve offered to bring front-end alignment tools for demonstrations.

Raffle & Member Draw

- Raffle items included a flag holder, 7 day pill box and a vintage game.
- Member Draw: Alan Salter (not present) \$5 remained in the club fund.

Adjournment: There was no formal motion to adjourn. The meeting concluded at approximately **11:00 a.m.**

A Model A, a Boy, and a Paper Route

In the early 1930s, during the Great Depression, a young boy in the Midwest helped his father with a daily paper route. Their delivery vehicle was a **Ford Model A pickup**. Every morning before school, the boy rode along, hopping out to toss newspapers while his father kept the engine idling.

One winter morning, the Model A refused to start. The temperature had dropped overnight, and the battery was weak. Rather than give up, the father showed his son how to **hand-crank the engine safely** — explaining where to stand, how to pull up (never push down), and why respect for the machine mattered.

The boy cranked. The engine caught. The route was finished on time.

Years later, that boy — now an old man — told the story at a local car club meeting. He said he didn't remember every paper he delivered, but he remembered **the feel of the crank in his hand**, the sound of the engine coming to life, and the pride of being trusted with something important. He credited that moment with sparking a lifelong love of cars — and with teaching him patience, responsibility, and confidence.

Before electric starters were common, some **Model A Fords could be started by hand** using a crank at the front of the car. Because the crank could kick back if used incorrectly, **only trained adults** handled it. Today, hand cranking is mostly used for demonstrations — a reminder of how much skill early drivers needed just to get going.

Technical Tips

A Valentine's Tune-Up for Your Model A ~A Little Comfort Goes a Long Way

February driving can be some of the most enjoyable of the year — crisp air, quiet roads, and engines that seem to run just a bit happier. Cooler weather also reminds us of something important: **comfort matters**, especially for the person riding beside us.

With Valentine's Day this month, it's a good time to remember that a few thoughtful adjustments can make a Model A far more inviting. Think of it as a small tune-up — not for the engine, but for the passenger you enjoy sharing the ride with.

Interior Comfort Tips

(Small improvements, noticeable difference)

- **Seat padding check** Over time, original padding compresses and springs can sag. Adding a thin layer of firm foam beneath the upholstery — without changing the car's appearance — can greatly improve comfort.
- **Draft control** Cold air often sneaks in around doors and floorboards. Inspect weatherstripping, toe boards, and mats. Even small gaps can make a winter ride noticeably colder.
- **Foot warmth** Extra floor mats or discreet insulation beneath the front mat help keep feet warm and reduce road noise.
- **Lap blankets** A wool lap blanket is period-appropriate, practical and always appreciated on a cool February drive.

Convertible Tops & Weather Protection

(Winter is a good time to get this right)

- **Top fit matters** A properly fitted top blocks wind far better than one that's loose or misaligned. Winter weather makes draft areas easier to identify.
- **Side curtains** Even if rarely used, well-fitted side curtains can transform a cold ride into a comfortable one.
- **Seals and fasteners** Check snaps, bows and header seals. Minor adjustments can eliminate drafts and rattles.
- **No top yet?** February is actually a good time to install or adjust one. Even partial weather protection is far warmer than none at all.

Jam Squares

“This is my favorite cookie — it’s delicious, and it carries a special memory for me. While living in Kijabe, Africa, the cooks at Rift Valley Academy often made jam squares for our Friday staff meetings. Every bite takes me back.”

— Jill

Ingredients

- 2¼ cups flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup butter
- 1 egg
- ½–¾ cup pecans, chopped
- ¾ cup strawberry jam

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to **350°** and generously grease a **9×13-inch pan**.
2. In a mixer or food processor, combine flour, sugar, butter, and egg. Mix until well blended.
3. Press **2/3 of the mixture** evenly into the prepared pan.
4. Bake for **about 15 minutes**, until lightly golden.
5. Meanwhile, mix the remaining dough with the chopped pecans to form the topping.
6. Remove crust from oven and spread jam evenly over the surface.
7. Sprinkle the pecan topping evenly over the jam.
8. Return to oven and bake an additional **15–20 minutes**, until lightly browned.
9. Cool completely before cutting into squares.

Perfect for sharing — and even better with a cup of coffee and good company.



Vintage Romantic: Dressing for the Tour

For those who enjoy dressing the part on club tours, a *vin-tage romantic* look offers an easy and flattering nod to the late 1920s and early 1930s — without sacrificing comfort.

Think **soft lines, feminine details, and practical elegance**. Flowy skirts or relaxed dresses (mid-calf to ankle length) move beautifully when stepping in and out of a Model A. Lightweight cardigans, shawls, or short jackets are both period-appropriate and useful for changing weather.

Fabrics with **gentle drape** — cotton, rayon, linen blends — feel right for touring. Subtle florals, small prints, or solid colors like cream, blush, sage, navy, or dusty rose keep the look timeless. A cloche-style hat, soft beret, or wide headband adds instant vintage charm, while low heels or dressy flats keep feet happy all day.

Accessories finish the look: a strand of pearls, a brooch, gloves tucked into a handbag, or a small crossbody purse. The goal isn't perfection — it's romance, ease, and the pleasure of stepping briefly into another era.






