Grandma's Baked Ham Salad Sandwiches

● Total Time Prep/Total Time: 30 Min.
Yield 6 Servings

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Test Kitchen Approved

Ingredients

- 2 cups cubed fully cooked ham
- 1/2 cup sliced sweet pickles
- 4 hard-boiled large eggs, finely chopped
- 3/4 cup finely chopped celery
- · 1/2 cup finely chopped sweet onion
- 1/4 cup mayonnaise
- · 6 onion rolls, split



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Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. Place ham and pickles in a food processor; pulse until almost smooth. Transfer to a small bowl; stir in eggs, celery, onion and mayonnaise. Spread 1/2 cup over each roll bottom; replace tops. Wrap each in foil and place on a baking sheet. Bake until heated through, 10-15 minutes.

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Skillet Lasagna



Total Time Prep/Total Time 30 Min.

Skillet Lasagna is made in a single skillet and features creamy, cheesy layers full of classic flavors.

The best part is no oven required.

INGREDIENT

¾ pound ground beef

2 garlic cloves, minced

1can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes with basil, oregano and garlic, undrained

2 jars (14 ounces each) spaghetti sauce

2/3 cup condensed cream of onion soup, undiluted

2 large eggs, lightly beaten

1 ¼ cup 1% cottage cheese

¾ teaspoon Italian seasoning

9 no-cook lasagna noodles

% cup shredded Colby-Monterey Jack cheese % cup shredded part-skim Mozzarella cheese

DIRECTIONS

In a large skillet, cook beef and garlic over medium heat until meat is no longer pink, breaking up beef into crumbles; drain.

Stir in tomatoes and spaghetti sauce; heat through. Transfer to a bowl.

In a small bowl, combine the soup, eggs, cottage cheese and Italian seasoning

Return 1 cup meat sauce to the skillet; spread evenly. Layer with 1 cup cottage cheese mixture, 1-1/2 cups meat sauce and half the noodles, breaking to fit. Repeat layers of cottage cheese mixture, meat sauce and noodles. Top with remaining meat sauce. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 15-17 minutes or until noodles are tender.

Remove from the heat. Sprinkle with cheese; cover and let stand for 2 minutes or until cheese is melted.

Several Suggestions on Adjusting Mechanical Brakes Series Next 4 Pages

Do Not Turn Up Clevises on Pull Rods for Average Brake Adjustments

The length of the brake pull rods connected to the levers at each brake is correctly set at the factory and *should not* be altered Car owners should be notified to this effect.

If the pull rods have been tampered with in an attempt to adjust the brakes readjust brakes as follows:

Operate the brake pedal quickly and snap it off several times to insure the brakes being fully released.

Disconnect the pull rods at adjustable clevises by removing cotters and clevis pins. Make certain that the brake equalizer levers under the center cross member are back against the stops (see "A," Fig. 412) and the brake cross shaft is in the bracket on the frame side member (see Fig. 413). **This is important!**

An easy method of keeping the cross shaft in the center of the bracket, while the adjustment is being made, is to insert a wooden wedge between the bracket and each side of the shaft.

Now with the brake equalizers against their stops; the brake cross shafts in the center of their brackets as previously described, pull forward on the rear brake rod just sufficiently to take up the free travel in the rear brake lever (the brakes are designed and machined to allow a small amount of free travel in each

brake lever) then adjust clevis until holes in clevis line up with hole in cross shaft lever and clevis pin can be inserted.

Next pull backward on front brake lever to take up free travel and adjust clevis until holes line up with hole in brake lever and clevis pin can be inserted.

Adjust brakes as previously described.

Brake Adjustment According To "Ford Barn" Method

Re: Model A 1930 brake adjustment

Ford said not to adjust the lengths of the rods. This assumes that the rods were not changed in the past. The rods should be checked to see if the proper angle is at the levers front and back. It is 15 degrees in front and I am not sure what it is in back but probably a little aft of vertical. Adjust for the drag in front first and if the brakes cannot be adjusted for drag then add a pellet or two (the spacer pills available from the vendors). Then adjust the rears for drag. Back off 2 clicks all around.

You can use the boards to get an idea of how they will respond when the brakes are applied and the particulars are not all that important. But the real test in in the driving.

Then take the car out for a test drive. The pedal should be firm and not spongy. If spongy it indicates that not all the brakes are being activated at the same time. The car should stop on dry asphalt within 25 feet at 20 miles per hour when you push all the way down on the pedal. You should get uniform black marks on the pavement from both rear tires. The car should not pull to either side. If the car pulls then back off the front brake one click on that side and try again. If one of the rear tire is not leaving a black mark tighten up that brake by one click and try again but not so much that you get a lot of drag there. Keep testing until you get good braking. If you cannot eliminate the pull to the side with loosening the brake on the side that is pulling with several clicks then try tightening up the other side but not until you get lots of drag. This is a trial and error effort.

Then take the car out for a normal drive where you use the brakes. Measure the temperature of the drums with an IR thermometer. They should be within 20 degrees side to side with the rears slightly higher. Not more than 120 degrees with normal use of the brakes.

The brakes may take a while to settle in, especially if you have done work on them. After a month or so do redo the driving test. This all assumes that the brakes are in good shape. If you cannot get the car to stop properly then you may need to work on the brakes.

Paul Shinn's Brake Adjustment Method

Model A 1930 brake adjustment

I'm confused as to the proper way to adjust the brakes. Below are the two methods I've found;

*Paul Shimm and Diablo DVD version-

Adjust all 4 wheel brake adjusters until there is a slight drag. Then back off 2 to 3 clicks.

Then install the board on the brake pedal at the 1st notch. Go around and adjust the brake shaft turnbuckle for a slight drag at each wheel. Then with the board at the 2nd notch adjust the brake shaft turnbuckles for a hard drag at each wheel. Then with the board at the 3rd notch adjust the brake shaft turnbuckles so all 4 wheels are locked. Then install all cotter pins.

*Les Andrew's Red Book-

Adjust all 4 wheel brake adjusters until there is a slight drag. Then back off 2 to 3 clicks.

Pull the brake rods forward to take up all free travel without activating the brakes. Adjust the clevis on the brake rod until the hole in the clevis lines up with the holes allowing the clevis pins to be inserted. Then install all cotter pins

Then install the board on the brake pedal at the 1st notch turn the brake adjusters so there is a slight drag at all 4 wheels. Then with the board at the 2nd notch turn the brake adjusters so there is a hard drag at each wheel. Then with the board at the 3rd notch, turn the brake adjusters so all 4 wheels are locked up.

Brake Rod Adjustment (1st Method)

Brake Rod Adjustment (2nd Method)

(No Author) Technical Info ADJUSTING BRAKE RODS Check all brake parts to be sure they work properly before adjusting rods. Disconnect all brake rods at the threaded clevises. Check to be sure that the brake pedal is all the way to the rear. With the rods disconnected adjust brake wedges until wheel locks up. Back brake wedges off 3 to 4 clicks or until wheel has just a slight drag. Pull the rear brake rod up to the cross shaft adjustable clevis so pin easily slips into clevis and arm. Remove pin and lengthen clevis two full turns. Replace clevis pins and cotter pin. Push the front wheel brake activating lever to the rear with the pin in the clevis. Adjust so the clevis slips over the activating arm. Remove pin and hook back up to arm. Replace cotter pin and tighten lock nut. djust this clevis

Even The Pedals!


It is quite common to find that the brake pedal and the clutch pedal on a Model A Ford do not return to the upright position so that they are even with one another. One pedal may sit lower than the other. This is caused by wear on the bell housing brake pedal stops, the clutch and brake pedal stops, and the clutch pedal collar stops.

There is a very easy way to correct the problem and it is best accomplished when a complete restoration of the bell housing is being done. The restoration should include a new pedal shaft, a new clutch release shaft, new bushings in the bell housing, and new bushings in both pedals.

To even the pedals up you should begin with a new clutch pedal collar, p/n 7507-C, that has no wear on it. Slide the brake pedal onto the pedal shaft and pull it up against the stop on the bell housing so that it is in the full upright position. This will be the reference point for adjusting the clutch pedal to be even with it.

Slide the clutch pedal onto the pedal shaft and install the clutch pedal collar and insert the locking pin. Pull the clutch pedal up to the full upright position with the pedal stops against the collar stops. The clutch pedal will probably be sitting lower than the brake pedal if you installed a new clutch pedal collar.


Carefully note where the clutch pedal stops are sitting against the collar stops. With a marking pen mark the location of the two collar stops that are in contact with the pedal stops. There are four stops on the collar, but you are only interested in the two you marked. Place the collar in a vice and carefully file material off both marked stops. Try to do it evenly. It is a trial and error fit process. As you remove material from the two collar stop positions the clutch pedal will start to move up even with the brake pedal. When the process is complete both pedals will be even regardless of the orientation of the clutch pedal collar. It can install on the pedal shaft two ways, but it won't make any difference in the pedal height.

At Gorman we register at the Hotel of your choice (2 Hotels recommended; Holiday Inn Express in Frazier Park; or Days Inn in Lebeck; make your own reservations) We're considering staying in Gorman Saturday night also as we probably will be traveling back to Visalia in the dark (some drivers might not like to travel home after sunset)!!


