## President's Message

Jeff's Update

I have been driving Jeff with improving skill regarding shifting gears smoothly and quietly. In my spare time I found a book The Ford Model A - As Henry Built It. It's the 4th Edition. Initially the descriptions year by year of the different models and factory exterior color combinations intrigued me to see what Jeff may have been originally painted. For 1931 the Deluxe Roadster came in four colors - Stone Brown, Brewster Green Medium, Black, and Washington Blue (Jeff's color). I know he has been repainted so I am guessing Valarie Basham wanted to kept him authentic. The book also stated that there were 52,997 built in 1931 in the four colors. It's just a bit of trivia that I will keep a record of. I wish the book was printed in color to help me appreciate the combinations of exterior and interior colors that paints and fabrics were used at the time of building him.



Skipping forward in the book I found the section that deals with the "new" brake design. Besides the thrill of shifting the tranny, my second surprise was stepping on the brake pedal for the first time. He was not slowing down as fast as I hoped. According to Guy McElroy the brakes are very good compared to some A's that he has driven. All I know is the first downhill stop at a T intersection I wasn't sure if it was going to stop. We did, but I was starting to sweat a little.

Back in the Ford book I found a page that described the new and improved brake design which initially was disapproved by the State of Pennsylvania and prevented the A from being registered. Basically the issue was the lack of an independent emergency brake. By March of 1928 Ford redesigned the system to the satisfaction of PA. There is a lengthy discussion on how the design would equalize braking on all four wheels. My next task will be to climb under Jeff and see what the rods and adjustments look like. One of these days I need to try an emergency stop and evaluate whether my new knee can apply that much force.

Finally I would like to bring up the business of the club to be discussed next month. The tradition of buying MAFCA bricks for past and present members needs to be reviewed since the club bank account may not support it. We also need to discuss next years officers and volunteers. If you can't make the meeting I may call a few people to discuss these two items.
