100 Years Ago at the Ford Motor Company

In January of 1926, sales were falling due to competition from the more modern Chevrolet. Executives at Ford were quietly discussing and planning for the replacement of the Model T, all except Henry Ford. He wasn't having it. Henry's son Edsel Ford and Vice President Ernest Kanzler were pushing for a 6-cylinder car and an intermediate model, as they knew that the "T" alone could not sustain them until such time the 6-cylinder Model "X" lines were ready.

Henry, known as a "monomaniacal genius," had a very big and sensitive ego, and the leaders knew that only he could have the innovative ideas. Going public with their concerns risked being disregarded, ridiculed, or even fired. Ernest Kanzler was brave enough to outline all of the concerns and arguments in an 8-page letter to Henry.

While Kanzler heaped lots of praise on Henry, he also wrote, "The advantage of this memorandum is that I can write certain things that I find difficult to say to you. It is one of the handicaps of the power of your personality which you perhaps least of all realize, but most people when with you hesitate to say what they think." It was probably not wise to criticize and tell someone with such a fragile ego what others were saying about him.

Henry soon fired Ernest Kanzler while son Edsel, Kanzler's brother-in-law, was out of the country. But Kanzler was right. In May of 1927, the 15 millionth and final Model "T" rolled off the assembly line just as General Motors was emerging as the leader in car sales.

Built in Texas by Texans

Per the article in the December *Cowtown A*, the Dallas Ford assembly plant produced thousands of Fords over the years and the sticker below was added at the end of the assembly line on the cars primarily from 1955 -1959, and displayed on the back window with those words nestled inside a lasso. You can find originals and reproductions available on Ebay.



Fair Isle Then and Now

Fair Isle sweaters, very popular today, actually gained notice in the United States and England in the early 1920s when the Prince of Wales (later King Edward VIII) sported the clothing noted for the 2-stranded knitting technique and their unique patterns. The Fair Isle is a tiny island located off the northern coast of Scotland where, going back to the late 18th century, wives of the fishermen knitted sweaters and caps for their husbands.

Fair Isle sweaters became extremely popular during the Model “A” era in the United States and the popularity has experienced a resurgence today. Just a few weeks ago, a video of Kate, Princess of Wales, showed her decorating a Christmas tree, while wearing a Fair Isle turtleneck sweater.

There are a few folks among the 55 permanent residents of the island who still knit the sweaters by hand, but expect a 3-year waiting list if you want one. In the meantime, you can look to familiar brands such as J. Crew, Banana Republic, and L.L. Bean who have been inspired by Fair Isle designs. You’ll be period correct wearing one while driving your Model “A” this winter.



Fashions of 1920s & 1930s



Eye Glasses of the Model A Era

Throughout the 1920s, glasses looked much like Harold Lloyd's above. Not just because the actor had popularized the look, but also because the affordable mass market choices were limited. Nevertheless, as the decade proceeded, tortoiseshell frames grew in popularity, while rimless glasses were seen on some who hoped to achieve a more subtle bespectacled look. In addition, nose pads were first introduced during the 1920s, and they were a game-changer. Before that, the nose bridge on glasses had to be designed to hug the nose so the glasses wouldn't fall off. Their invention sparked never-before-seen eyewear styles.

The 1930s saw several important developments in eyeglass style. Although round was still popular, a rounded octagonal shape was making headway, possibly the result of a 1931 Life magazine cover featuring an octagon spectacle-wearing, Ernest Weir — a then well-known steel industry tycoon. Octagonal glasses were either rim-less, wire-rimmed, or some combination of both.

Metal frames grew in popularity throughout the '30s, as did plastic frames, which were now available as an option and capable of being mass-marketed thanks to technological advances. Plastic frames grew in popularity as a lighter, more affordable alternative to animal horns, shells, and other
