## Try a 1930's Thanksgiving standard Recipe Ingredients

## 4 cups pearl onions

3 tablespoons butter

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

Dash pepper

3/4 cup chicken broth

3/4 cup half-and-half

1/4 cup minced fresh parsley

3 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Pimiento strips, optional

#### **Directions**

1. In a Dutch oven or large kettle, bring 8 cups water to a boil. Add pearl onions; boil until tender, 6-7 minutes. Drain and rinse in cold water; peel and set aside. 2. In a saucepan, melt butter. Stir in the flour, salt and pepper until smooth. Gradually stir in broth and cream. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in the parsley, cheese and onions. 3. Pour into an ungreased 1-1/2-qt. baking dish. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Remove from the refrigerator 30 minutes before baking. Cover and bake at 350° for 15 minutes; stir. Top with pimientos if desired. Bake, uncovered, 10 minutes longer or until bubbly and heated through.

## Henry Ford Village and city

Henry Ford was very interested in developing village industries. He built small factories in Michigan so that people could work and farm during different seasons. His idea was also to use agricultural products in industrial production, including soybean-based plastic automobile components.




## Tiny Tips

#### HEAD BOLTS


When you tighten your head bolts there is a recommended pattern. The exact tightening sequence should follow the pattern which is to start at the center and work towards each end in a methodical manner.

The man had actually driven it across the states, which put him in a rare class of adventurers somewhere between Marco Polo and the AAA roadside assistance guy.

As I flipped through the pages, admiring the scenery, a familiar face stopped me cold. There was Mom — smiling beside the members car, somewhere in the Midwest, her hair windblown and her eyes bright. She'd passed away a couple years back, and seeing her there — in that book, frozen in time with a Model A in the background — hit me right in the carburetor.

I smiled, blinked a few extra times for good measure, and kept turning the pages. That's the thing about these old cars and clubs — they're not just about grease fittings and valve clearances. They're about people. The ones still turning wrenches, and the ones who left their fingerprints on the fenders long ago.

By two o'clock, the seminar dissolved as naturally as it had formed. Hugs, handshakes, and promises to "see you at the next one" echoed across the driveway. Dad and I loaded up the truck — dutch oven-less but richer for the day.

After dropping Dad off, I headed back up the 5 toward Santa Clarita. The sun was dipping low, and my mind wandered to Mom, photos, and the upcoming San Fernando Valley Model A Club Swap Meet and Car Show.

The reconfiguration of the field was well received by most, with a few minor adjustments for next year.




