





### FUEL CAP AIR BREATHING

If your Model "A" stops due to lack of fuel, the first check should be for a vacuum lock in the fuel tank. As the Model "A" fuel system relies on gravity feed, it is essential that atmospheric pressure is maintained in the space between the fuel and the inside of the tank. The fuel cap vent holes must be clean and free to allow the tank to breathe. The fuel cap and radiator cap are similar but they are different in structure in that the fuel cap is vented.

This problem is very real and I know of three cases including our first run in our Model "A". After coming to a halt after driving for some time, I received assistance from fellow Club members. When the fuel cap was



removed to check the fuel level, I heard the rush of air into the tank as the atmospheric pressure was restored. The cap was left loose for the remainder of the run until the vent holes could be cleaned.

## **"A" W**ord on Fashion

### Ladies Headwear (Part II)

Cloche Hat - The word "cloche" hat first appeared in the early 1910s and is a term employed to describe women's hats that feature a deep, soft, bell-shaped crown (cloche is the French word for a bell). The spacious crown would comfortably fit around an elaborate hairdo, eliminating the need for hat pins. Hats with such crowns were labeled as having a cloche style, however brims were still quite large.

The earliest example of what we would consider today an authentic cloche hat could be found in France. It was made by the world-renown milliner Caroline Reboux, who since 1860 has been an internationally celebrated milliner who would design headwear for the crowned heads of Europe in her workshop located on Place de l'Opera in Paris. 





# Presenting

The

# FLAPPER of the MONTH







This month we feature Jean Arthur. Jean was born Gladys Georgianna Greene in Plattsburgh, New York in 1900. Discovered by Fox Film Studios while modeling in the early 1920s, Jean landed a one-year contract and debuted in 1923. She then received her first lead role. With her lack of acting talent, the director replaced her during the third day of shooting. She planned to leave the film industry for good, but stayed due to her contract. Change came when she impressed the owner of Action Pictures. He cast her in over 20 Westerns in a two-year period. In 1928, after appearing in a small role with Famous Players Studio, they gave her a three-year contract. That studio became known as Paramount Pictures. When her contract expired, she was released. She returned to New York and appeared on Broadway. Two years later, she returned to Hollywood with more acting experience and landed a contract with Columbia. She became their top star, working with Gary Cooper, James Stewart, and Cary Grant. In 1944, she announced her retirement when her contract expired. After that, she appeared in only two more films. Her last film, Shane, in1953, was her biggest box-office hit and the only color film in which she appeared. Jean lived in Carmelby-the-Sea, California, for 30 years and died from heart failure in 1991 at the age of 90.
