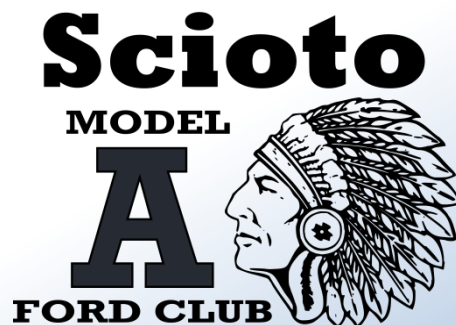

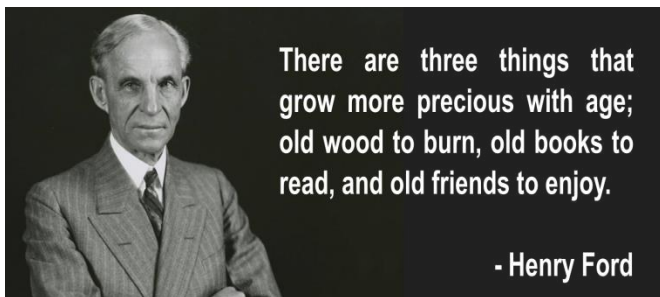
# NOTICE

They often featured shallow, flat crowns, which make it impossible to wear at forehead level without crushing either the hairdo or the hat itself. These hats required a lot of care and maintenance. Your Board of Directors has just approved a preliminary budget and formed a committee, led by Chris DuVall, to review and make changes to our complete social media strategy and website. The committee will begin meeting on a frequent basis and we will keep you updated on our progress.

Also, speaking of Chris, he recently posted a brief video on our Facebook page on the basics of starting a Model "A". We need more videos like this to teach new Model "A" owners the basics of diagnosing and fixing mechanical issues. ## *Over 65 Years of Fun!*

This picture was taken fifty-nine years ago. It features some of the Scioto Model "A" Ford Club members at one of the major fund raising events that they used to hold. This was their very popular White Elephant fund raiser. The White Elephant fund raiser was an event, similar to a garage sale. Club members would clear out their garages and gather up their unwanted items, sometimes quirky, but mostly Model "A" related. They would then donate them to the Club, where they would be sold off to the highest bidder. The name comes from the concept of a "white elephant" – an expensive, burdensome, and hard-to-dispose-of item—but in this context, it's a fun way to sell "one man's trash" at low prices to a new home, turning unwanted items into a profit for a good cause. ## BACKYARD TECH TIP



### SETTING THE AIR IDLE SCREW

To properly set the Air Idle Screw:

1. Start your Model "A" and warm it up to operating temperature.
2. Push the spark advance lever (left hand lever) all the way up.
3. With the vehicle idling, adjust the Air Idle Screw as follows. Turn it in (clockwise, which is richer) until the engine starts to run poorly. Note the position of the slot.
4. Now adjust it counter clockwise (leaner) until the engine starts to run smoothly. Continue turning it counter clockwise until the engine starts to run poorly. Note the position (how many turns).
5. Turn the idle screw back (clockwise) to half way between the positions found in steps number 3 and 4.

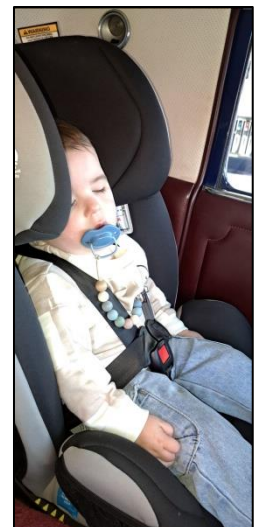


Somewhere a little back and /or forward you will find where your engine runs smoothest. This adjustment may not have a great effect on some Model "A" carburetors. This usually means there is an air leak into your carburetor. Often this is wear in the throttle shaft or a gasket is damaged.

This month we feature Madge Bellamy. She was born Margaret Philpott in Hillsboro, Texas in 1899. Before graduating, she headed to New York City and became a dancer on Broadway. Madge joined a touring production in 1918. Her first film was a supporting role in 1920. She then signed a three-year contract with Triangle Film. Once her contract ended, she signed with Fox, where she stayed for the next five years. In 1925, she started arguing over "artistic differences" with studio executives. She refused to accept a role in the silent epic Ben-Hur. In 1928, Bellamy was cast in Fox's first part-talking film. She married in January that year, but separated four days later after a fight over her husband eating ham and eggs. They were divorced by April. In 1929, she walked out on her contract at Fox after refusing to star in a film that the studio bought just for her to appear in. She attempted to find work as a freelance actress but did not work again until 1932, starring in low budget films. By the early 40's, her career was fading fast. In 1943, she was arrested and charged with assault with a deadly weapon after firing a revolver at a former lover. She was given a suspended six-month sentence and one year of probation. The shooting effectively ended her already fading career. Madge died of heart failure in 1990 at the age of 90.
