**A** few new ideas.....Let's try to drive our Model A's more, to meetings and other events.



The *Friend Telegraph* on December 11, 1925, remarked in an editorial entitled "How Times Change": In Christmas seasons gone by, it was not considered good form for a young man to give his best girl articles of wearing apparel. To do so indicated that her people neglected to clothe her. A man's gift had to be an album, a toilet set or something along that line.

In the 1920s Christmas giving grew more sensible giving the recipient gifts they could use. People bought more for the home. Rather than pictures and mementos, a chair, a new rug, dishes or silverware, labor-saving devices and even new-fangled cooking utensils became favorite gifts. "Give a woman something serviceable to wear or something she can use in her home and you gladden her heart. Give a man something for his auto, or something he can wear besides neckties, and you win his thanks."

The 1920s became the age of flapper fashion and jazz music. New fashions in art and architecture, from art deco to modernism jumped into fashion. Frank Lloyd Wright built his ultra-modern homes. In 1927, Lindbergh made the first flight across the Atlantic. ## Sausage and Peppers Sandwich

● Total Time Prep: 20 Min. Bake: 30 Min.

Yield 6 Servings



Test Kitchen Approved

These sausage and pepper sandwiches are sweet and savory and they're finished with a layer of molten provolone to make it even more decadent.

### Ingredients

- 1 pound uncooked sweet Italian turkey sausage links, roughly chopped
- 3 medium sweet red peppers, seeded and sliced
- 1 large onion, halved and sliced
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 6 hot dog buns, split
- 6 slices provolone cheese

### Directions

- Preheat oven to 375°. Place sausage pieces in a 15x10x1-in. sheet pan, arranging peppers and onion around sausage. Drizzle olive oil over sausage and vegetables; bake, stirring mixture after 15 minutes, until sausage is no longer pink and vegetables are tender, 30-35 minutes.
- During the last 5 minutes of baking, arrange buns cut side up in a second sheet pan; top each bun bottom with a cheese slice. Bake until buns are golden brown and cheese is melted. Spoon sausage and pepper mixture onto bun bottoms. Replace tops.

## Apple Blackberry Pie

● Total Time Prep: 20 Min. Bake: 50 Min.

Yield 8 Servings

This apple blackberry pie recipe combines fresh, vibrant blackberries and tender sliced apples for the ultimate dessert.



### Ingredients

- Dough for double-crust pie
- 5 cups thinly sliced peeled tart apples (about 5 medium)
- 1 pint fresh blackberries, rinsed and drained
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 large egg
- 1 tablespoon water or milk

### Directions

- On a lightly floured surface, roll out half the dough to fit a 9-in. pie plate; trim to 1 in. beyond rim of plate. Top with a thin layer of apples. In a large bowl, combine blackberries and remaining apples; sprinkle with lemon juice. Combine sugar and cornstarch. Add to fruit mixture; toss gently to coat. Spoon into crust; dot with butter.
- Roll out remaining dough; make a lattice crust. Trim, seal and flute edges. Beat egg with water; brush over lattice top and pie edges.
- Bake at 375° for 50 minutes or until filling is bubbly and apples are tender. Cool on a wire rack. Serve warm or at room temperature.

Pumpkin Apple Pie

Total Time: Prep: 20 Minutes Bake: 50 Minutes Servings—8

This cozy pumpkin apple pie combines the best aromas and flavors of two signature fall desserts into one irresistible treat.

### INGREDIENTS

Dough for single-crust pie	1/3 cup packed brown sugar
1 tablespoon cornstarch	1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon salt	1/3 cup water
2 tablespoon butter	3 cups sliced peeled tart apples
Pumpkin layer	3/4 cup canned pumpkin
3/4 cup evaporated milk	1/3 cup sugar
1 large egg, room temperature	1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
(optional: whipped cream or vanilla ice cream)	

### DIRECTIONS

- Preheat oven to 375 degrees. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to 1/8-in-thick circle; transfer to a 9-in pie plate. Trim crust to 1/2 in beyond rim of plate; flute edge.
- In a saucepan, combine the brown sugar, cornstarch, cinnamon and salt. Stir in water until smooth. Add the butter; bring to a boil. Add apples. Cook and stir for 4 minutes.
- Add apple mixture to crust. In a bowl, whisk the pumpkin, milk, sugar, egg, cinnamon and salt until smooth; pour over apple layer. If desired, decorate edge with crust leaves.
- Bake until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean, 50-55 minutes. If necessary, cover edges with foil during the last 15 minutes of baking time to prevent overbrowning. Cool completely. If desired, serve with whipped cream or ice cream.

Store in the refrigerator



Pumpkin Biscuits




### Ingredients

1. 1-3/4 cups all purpose flour	2. 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
3. 2-1/2 teaspoons baking powder	4. 1/2 teaspoon salt
5. 1/4 teaspoon baking soda	6. 3/4 cup canned pumpkin
7. 1/2 cup plus 1-1/2 teaspoons cold butter, divided	8. 1/3 cup buttermilk

### Directions

- In a large bowl, combine the flour, brown sugar, baking powder, salt and baking soda. Cut in 1/2 cup butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Combine pumpkin and buttermilk; stir into crumb mixture just until moistened.
- Turn onto a lightly floured surface; knead 8-10 times. Pat or roll out to 1-inch thickness; cut with a floured 2-1/2 inch biscuit cutter. Place 1 inch apart on a greased baking sheet.
- Bake at 425 for 18-22 minutes or until golden brown. Melt remaining butter; brush over biscuits. Serve warm.

# FIRST RELEASE OF THE MODEL A FORD DECEMBER 2, 1927

In late November came the announcement that Americans had been waiting for: On December 2, 1927, the still-unnamed Ford automobile would be shown to the public, at locations revealed to each and every Ford dealer. Pricing was announced on December 1, the eve of the showing, and to the delight of potential buyers, the new Model A would be priced comparably to the Model T. On the day of the car's reveal, *Ford News*, claimed that 10,534,992 people came to see the Model A, a number that represented 10 percent of the U.S. population at the time.

The Model A offered buyers elegant styling (described as a "downsized Lincoln" by some), four-wheel brakes, improved fuel economy, a laminated safety glass windshield, hydraulic shock absorbers, and a 200.5 cu.in. four-cylinder engine rated at 40 horsepower, enough to deliver a top speed of 65 MPH. Seven body types were offered at launch, including Sport Coupe, Coupe, Roadster, Phaeton, Tudor sedan, Fordor sedan, and truck, and buyers could choose from four colors (Niagara Blue, Arabian Sand, Dawn Gray and Gun Metal Blue).

Deposits from eager customers poured in, and in the first two weeks the automaker had reportedly accumulated 400,000 sales orders from dealers (adding to the thousands of orders that had been placed prior to the car's reveal). Though the Model A would only be produced from 1927 through early 1932, Ford sold over 4.3 million examples, and the car would help Ford transition from pioneer to modern automaker. The Model A would also go on to inspire generations of collectors, hot rodders and shade tree mechanics, helping to popularize the hobby that we've all come to know and love.



### FORD MODEL "A" MECHANICAL TIPS

#### How to Cure Backfiring & Overheating

(From the Tulsa, Oklahoma Chapter MAFCA)



#### How to Cure Backfiring

Backfiring is usually caused by the condenser failing, or the points may not have sufficient gap. Make sure they are set at .018 to .020". Make sure they are not burnt.

Backfiring can be caused by intermittent firing of the ignition system or very lean fuel mixture. If the car has been setting for a while, the carburetor float valve may be sticking. Clean the float valve good and set the float level. Backfiring due to intermittent ignition can be caused by a frayed wire on the bottom side of the distributor plate . . or .. by intermittent connection of the ignition switch.

#### Potential Solutions:

- Check point setting first.
- Replace condenser next (unless you are using modern points). Make sure the condenser you buy is the right length, some are too short. Make sure that it is good quality.
- Check that the carburetor float valve is operating correctly.
- Sometimes the pop out type ignition switches get intermittent. As a last resort, replace the ignition switch/cable.
- Check the GAV to make sure it is not set too lean

#### How to Deal with Model A Overheating

There are several things that can cause a Model A to overheat. The main cause is usually the radiator. First you can check to see if your radiator has 3 rows of tubes. Some of the older replacement radiators had only 2 rows. That will not provide sufficient cooling. If the radiator is old and has been in the car a long time, the fins of the radiator become loose and cannot dissipate the heat. Also, if the radiator is old calcium deposits in the radiator will reduce the cooling efficiency of the radiator.

Like many Model A owners we had to replace a radiator as once we got the car over 40 MPH it would get hot. The radiator had 3 tubes but only 6 fins per inch (normal) plus the flow rate was quite slow. The new core that was put on has 12 fins per inch plus they are crinkled to provide maximum cooling surface area. Replacing the radiator along with slowing the rate of flow (installed a Thermo-stat) stopped the overheating on our "A".

**Other potential causes of overheating:** First make sure the timing is set correctly. Then make sure nothing is blocking the front of the radiator, like a license plate. If you have a new engine, it will sometimes run hot until it is broken in. There are several books and articles that have been written that will tell how to correctly set the timing. A blown head gasket can also cause overheating. Check for bubbles in the water at the filler neck. This may indicate a blown head gasket. Running your car too lean (Gas Adjustment Valve, GAV) can also contribute to your motor running hot. In hot weather there can be many contributing factors.



# Tech For Your Model A Ford

## Tech Tips

### Mounting Wheels on Brake Drums

Too many people don't know the importance and the correct way to mount a wheel on the brake drum.

Sometimes the threads on the bolts are dry and screwing the lug nuts on pull the threads off and could break the bolt. A little lubrication can prevent this. If the threads are slightly damaged a die nut can be run over the threads to straighten them up and then a new nut should be used. Some of the lug nuts in our V-8's are hard to come by. If the threads are too badly damaged the bolt has to be replaced by pressing out with a press (without distorting drum or hub). The bolt then needs to be pressed back in with a special tool used in the press called a swedging tool. This tool enlarges the portion of the bolt that sticks through the brake drum. This aligns the bolt and keeps it from falling out.

When tightening the nuts you should do it in a criss-cross pattern, tighten to about one half the specified torque then tighten to the full torque specified. On our V-8's the torque is 70# to 80# ft/lb. If this is not done, the wheels, drums and hubs could be distorted. If bolts are lubricated you should stick to the lower torque as threads have less friction and are easy to over tighten.


