CAR FINANCING A CENTURY AGO

The introduction of auto financing in the 1920s had a profound impact on car ownership and the auto industry. Financing, specifically for automobile purchase, began to be offered by dealerships and banks, and this led to a rapid increase in car ownership. Owning a car became a symbol of prosperity and modernity, and many people were eager for the freedom afforded by mobility.

The emphasis on financing resulted in potential buyers considering a wider range of vehicles, from economy to luxury models. This was certainly noticed by the folks at the Ford Company as they were still churning out the low cost Model T in 1925.

Automobile financing transformed car ownership and fueled related industries including road construction and gasoline production. This contributed to the overall economic growth during the Roaring Twenties.

ONE HUNDRED YEARS AGO AT FORD

Henry Ford was focused on his vision of making cars affordable for the average American, which contributed to the rise of car culture in the U.S. Ford Motor Company was expanding its manufacturing capabilities, investing in new plants, and increasing production efficiency, which included advancements in assembly line techniques.

The relationship between Ford and its workers was evolving. The company was known for paying its workers well compared with other auto makers, which helped reduce turnover and improve productivity, but labor movements and unionization efforts were becoming more prominent.

These elements contributed to the Ford Company's position as a leader in the automotive industry in the U.S. and set the stage for future innovations and models.




