

EDITOR'S LETTER

or the first time, my family hauled an A to the MARC National Meet, and the trip was an absolute success with no breakdowns.

TECH TALK

| Roadside Troubleshooting • Courtesy of The Ridge Runner Newsletter |

arry Shepherd, MARC's Technical Director, held an informative Roadside
Troubleshooting seminar at the 2025 MARC National Meet in Gettysburg. Here are
some interesting points he shared:

When checking voltage:

- Poor grounds are often an issue. Clean, scuff, and/or sand ground connections until they are shiny metal.
- The starter switch lug should have the same voltage as your battery voltage, usually around 6.1 volts.
- The Terminal Box stud on the driver side should have the same (or within 1/10th of a volt) voltage as the starter switch voltage.
- The Terminal Box stud on the passenger side should have the same voltage as the starter lug voltage.
- Terminal Box studs should be tight. Reproductions are plastic with screw studs that loosen easily and can short out on the firewall. Use epoxy on the screw heads to ensure the screw studs do not back out to the firewall and become a direct short.
- Both coil terminals should have about the same voltage.

When looking for an electrical fault:

- Start at the battery, which should have tight cable connections.
- The ground cable should have a clean frame connection.
- Battery cable needs to be tight at the starter.
- Terminal Box connections and ammeter connections need to be tight.
- The armored ignition cable should not be screwed into the distributor too tightly, or it can short out. The distributor plate rivets must be tight.

Other tips:

- Larry recommends the original point system, not modern ones.
- A slow start can be caused by bad connections (ground, negative hot lead, a questionable battery, 12-volt cables on a 6-volt car, etc.)
- Make sure the points are clean. Use 600 grit sandpaper or finer to clean them up.
- O'Reilly Auto Parts tend to stock a 6V coil on the shelf, part number 2-5002.
- Coil wires should be wired and soldered to the tips to prevent connectivity issues.
- He favors a Fluke 77 multimeter when troubleshooting a Model A.
- Last but not least: "90% of all carburetor problems are electrical!"


MARC Technical Director Larry Shepard asked for anyone with questions about mechanical problems to email him a question and he will try to answer your question in the MARC magazine.

Well done, all the way around. It was a great group of friends having a great time playing with cars.






